## **Council Presidents' Remarks**

#### **Interfraternity Council**

During 2024, our council has accomplished a lot. In Spring 2024, the Vice Presidents of Risk Management partnered with the Society for Alcohol and Drug Education to partner on a program focusing on the dangers of opiod overdose and how to use NARCAN. This is going to be an event we hope to co-host and open to all MSU Students each semester.

In Fall 2024 we reached out to the Residence Hall Association to work with them and discuss how we can better partner and how we can expand our connection to students in the Residence Halls. As a result of this, we partnered with them, for the first time, on the annual RHA Volleyball Tournament. Members of our community helped staff and run the tournament during Welcome Week.

This semester, we had 15 men go through formal recruitment. We also hosted the annual U-Lead Conference, planned by the VP of Member Education and Development. The U-Lead keynote speaker came from Phired Up Productions and focused their sessions on recruiting for organizations. During Family weekend VP of Community Service and Philanthropy hosted the second annual Pancake Breakfast. We raised around \$1400 which help pays for community leaders to travel to the AFLV leadership conference.
